'Manuscripts under the Glass' is out!*



March 6, 2010, at the end of the annual general meeting, the Gabriël Manuscript Studygroup was very proud to present to the members present the new edition of 'Manuscripts under the Glass'.

Since its first publication, when Gabriël in Holland celebrated its 50th anniversary, a great many new stamps relating to medieval book art have come out and a revision became soon urgent.

It appeared that great efforts have been made by all the members of the group and this resulted in a complete new edition entitled :

*Manuscripts under the Glass,  
the magic of medieval script and its illustration*

They succeeded in their efforts to bring and write together as much information as possible on stamps, booklets and other postal items relating to the theme of medieval script and its illustrations, such as capital letters, miniature paintings and the like.

The countries, from Aitutaki to Zwitserland are set in alphabetical order, Michel and Yvert numbers are mentioned. Of nearly all stamps, (ca. 1000!) pictures in black- and- white are added.

The book of 266 pages – A4 size – will be a handy support, not only for collectors of medieval book art, but also those interested in church history, saints, royal families etc. will find, if they master the dutch language, useful news.
